BSEC-URTA WORKING PROGRAMME FOR 2012

The BSEC-URTA Member Associations are kindly requested to review below the vision, mission, strategic objectives and 2012 working program of the BSEC-URTA, which will be approved by the 20th Meeting of the BSEC-URTA General Assembly:-

VISION

Common solutions for common problems.

MISSION

To work together with governments and the BSEC Organization, to enable road transport to deliver goods in a cost efficient manner, secure, smoothly and safely in an integrated BSEC road transport market and beyond, by interconnecting businesses, markets and all stakeholders to the best interest of society.

STRATEGIC OBJECTIVES

- 1. **Facilitation**. Work together with the BSEC, its Related Bodies, the IRU and the Governments to develop and further facilitate road transport by implementing main UN international conventions and existing or new multilateral agreements aimed at eliminating barriers to road transport, removing any discriminatory measures, harmonizing and simplifying border crossing procedures.
- 2. **IRU-BSEC Interaction**. Obtain support of the IRU on solving regional problems and setting priorities regarding the road goods transport, channel its expertise, know how and guidance to the work of the BSEC organs and the Related Bodies.
- 3. **Re-opening of the Silk Road**. Support international activities and projects aimed at promoting re-opening of the Silk Road to modern truck, and develop contacts and cooperation in this connection, with the IRU Member Associations and other interested stakeholders from the countries along the historic Silk Road Routes, which are not represented in the BSEC Organisation.
- 4. **Professional Training**. Support the Member Associations to give professional training to national industry on international standards of the IRU Academy and encourage cooperation between the Member Associations in this field.
- 5. **Combined Transportation**. Support improvement of existing and development of new combined transportation services in the BSEC region.
- 6. **Lobbying and Promotion**. Organize with the Member Associations, IRU, BSEC and National Governments or contribute to the meetings, seminars, conferences, exhibitions and other types of events with a view to improving public image of road goods transport, protecting its common interests and creating new opportunities, particularly on the regional level.
- 7. **Good Examples**. Promote good examples and success stories among the Member Associations as well as their members and support roll out of best practices across the BSEC region.
- 8. **Information Sharing**. Make or contribute to regional researches and surveys about road transport industry in the BSEC region, and share available professional information with the BSEC fleet operators and Member Associations through the BSEC-URTA web portal.

WORKING PROGRAMME FOR 2012

Facilitation:

GRADUAL LIBERALIZATION OF BILATERAL AND TRANSIT ROAD TRANSPORT

- a. Support further development of the BSEC Permit in 2012 in cooperation with the BSEC-URTA Member Associations, the Permanent International Secretariat of the BSEC Organization (BSEC PERMIS), and the Chairmanship of the Steering Committee for Facilitation of Road Transport of Goods (SC.F) as well as the IRU.
- b. Encourage the Participating BSEC Member States to allow holders of the BSEC Permit to enter empty the territories of other Participating States with the purpose of bilateral or transit road transport of goods.
- c. Visit together with concerned Member Associations the national authorities in Bulgaria, and Ukraine in order to request their participation in the BSEC Permit Project by taking into account its current and future benefits to their national hauliers.
- d. Encourage the competent BSEC organs as well as the Participating BSEC Member States to transform the BSEC Permit Pilot Project to a permanent activity of the BSEC PERMIS starting with 2013.

2. SIMPLIFICATION OF VISA PROCEDURES FOR PROFESSIONAL DRIVERS

- a. Work together with the concerned Member Associations to obtain signatures of the Governments of Georgia, Serbia and Ukraine on the BSEC Agreement on Simplification of Visa Procedures for Professional Lorry Drivers Nationals of the BSEC Member States, which is open to signature of interested BSEC Member States since 23 October 2008.
- b. Promote to the BSEC Member States the profession of *international truck driver*, who should be granted facilitated conditions of mobility to be able to perform their profession freely similar in nature with the sailors or aircraft crews.

3. INTERNATIONAL VEHICLE WEIGHT CERTIFICATE (IVWC)

a. Follow up to the decision of the Steering Committee on Facilitation of Road Transport of Goods (Rostov on Don, 28 September 2011) to hold in 2012 a Meeting of Experts with participation of the UNECE, IRU and BSEC-URTA on implementation of the International Vehicle Weight Certificate in the BSEC region under Annex 8 to the International Convention on Harmonization of Frontier Controls of Goods, 1982.

4. SIMPLIFICATION OF CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

- a. Participate in the work of the BSEC Working Group on Customs (WG-C) and promote main UN trade and road transport facilitation conventions as well as the WCO international agreements on development of standards and technical support for the harmonization of procedures governing the movement of people and goods.
- b. Encourage the WG-C to consider further the issue of avoiding repeated X- Ray Controls performed on trucks/goods/crews during an international carriage of goods by roads, if possible by developing a new international x-ray control certificate at multilateral level.
- c. Support the BSEC PERMIS to publish on its webpage the IRU information about customs procedures and charges related with international road transport of goods in the BSEC Member States.

5. BSEC-URTA FACILITATION PROGRAM

 Support regional projects and activities involving three or more BSEC-URTA Member Associations or BSEC Member Countries, in principle, the BSEC, the IRU and interested leading international and regional organizations, which are aimed at promoting or supporting the abovementioned BSEC-URTA objectives as regards the facilitation of road transport in the BSEC region.

6. PROMOTE ROAD SAFETY IN THE BSEC REGION

- a. Support and contribute to the BSEC activities for promoting road safety in the BSEC region.
- b. Print together with the BSEC PERMIS a regional road safety leaflet.

IRU-BSEC Interaction:

1. IRU-BSEC COOPERATION

- a. Contribute to implementation of the MoU between the BSEC Organization and the IRU if and when possible.
- b. Coordinate participation of the BSEC Secretary General or his delegates to take part in the events organised by the IRU and BSEC-URTA and vice versa.

2. IRU COOPERATION WITH THE BSEC RELATED BODIES

a. Encourage and contribute to systematic interaction and cooperation with the BSEC Related Bodies on transport and trade facilitation in the BSEC region.

Re-opening of the Silk Road:

1. BSEC-URTA SILK ROAD PROGRAM

- a. Support regional projects and activities involving three or more BSEC-URTA Member Associations or BSEC Member Countries, in principle, the BSEC, the IRU and interested leading international and regional organizations, which are aimed at promoting or supporting the re-opening of the historic Silk Road across the BSEC region.
- b. Contribute to the work of the IRU and the BSEC Related Bodies, notably the Parliamentary Assembly of the BSEC Organization (PABSEC) to create an informal Inter-Parliamentary Silk Road Initiative.

Professional Training:

1. COOPERATION WITH THE IRU ACADEMY

a. Support the IRU Academy to organise regional meetings and seminars in partnership with the BSEC and BSEC Related Bodies with a view to promoting and developing professional training at the international standards of the IRU Academy.

2. COOPERATION AT THE BSEC LEVEL

a. Encourage the BSEC Member States to revitalize any efforts for mutual recognition of diplomas and certificates issued for professional training of drivers and transport managers in the BSEC region, which meet international standards set for such training products and services particularly in terms of quality and content.

Combined Transportation:

1. IMPROVEMENT OF FACILITIES AND SERVICES

- a. Update the survey on existing Ro-Ro services in the Black Sea region in order to provide Member Associations with information about operator, service price, frequency and itinerary.
- Invite Ro-Ro operators in the Black Sea region to attend the BSEC-URTA meetings and develop new cooperation.
- c. Participate in the Meetings of the BSEC SC-Motorways of the Black Sea and support the implementation of the related BSEC MoU..

Lobbying and Promotion:

1. COOPERATION BETWEEN TRANSPORT RELATED BSEC NGOs

- a. Participate in the meetings and events organized by the transport related BSEC NGOs.
- Recommend to the BRASS, BASPA and BINSA the organization of a leadership coordination meeting in 2012.

2. COOPERATION WITH THE BSEC PERMIS AND THE BSEC RELATED BODIES

 Organize mutual working visits whenever necessary and make annual debriefings on activities and policy priorities of the BSEC-URTA.

Good Examples:

1. REGIONAL ACKNOWLEDGMENT

- a. Invite the Member Associations to announce their most successful members in order to acknowledge the best transport operators in the BSEC region.
- b. Publish on the BSEC-URTA website interviews with and information about the most successful BSEC transport operators as nominated by the Member Associations.

Information Sharing:

1. BSEC-URTA WEB PORTAL

- a. Publish the BSEC-URTA official documents on the portal and keep it updated with professional news and regional developments.
- b. Encourage the Member Associations to contribute to the content of the BSEC-URTA web portal by sharing information on the past or future main activities as well as recent developments and news at national level.

2. REGIONAL TRANSPORT STATISTICS

a. Update the BSEC-URTA Regional Outlook Report according to information provided by the Member Associations about industry performance and market developments as well as any other information obtained from various other sources particularly with respect to foreign trade and border crossing waiting times.

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
