REVIEW OF THE BSEC-URTA STATUTES

At its 38th Meeting, held in Istanbul on 4 February 2016, the BSEC-URTA Management Council exchanged views on structural reformation of BSEC-URTA as follows:-

Membership

- a) Core of BSEC-URTA is composed of Members, which are IRU National Associations in 12 BSEC Member States, and this core should be maintained in the future,
- b) Non-IRU National Associations can be granted Member status if a country is not represented by an IRU National Association within the BSEC-URTA,
- c) Non-IRU National Associations, which are granted Member status, cannot vote against future Membership of an IRU National Association from the same country,
- d) Observers, which completed 2 years within the Union and are active in a region neighbouring the BSEC region, may be granted Member status by consensus,

Terms of Office

- a) Term of office of the President may be 4 years,
- b) Terms of office of the Deputy President and 2 Vice-Presidents may be 2 years,

Other

- a) Seat of the Secretariat is in Istanbul, currently, but its location could be made flexible,
- b) Staff Regulations, which define details of tasks within the Secretariat, should be referred to under Article 12 (Secretary General of BSEC-URTA) of the Statutes,

In view of the foregoing, at its 39th Meeting in Bucharest on 26 May 2016, the BSEC-URTA Management Council agreed to present the following statutory modifications to 29th meeting of the General Assembly (Annex 1).
