ACTIVITY REPORT ON THE BSEC-URTA PRIORITIES FOR 2016

Since the 29th Meeting of the BSEC-URTA General Assembly held in Bucharest, Romania, on 26 May 2016, the International Secretariat participated in events of importance for the industry, contributed to international gatherings and worked for promotion of the BSEC-URTA and its objectives.

A summary of these activities according to the BSEC-URTA strategic objectives, Working Program for 2016 and short-term priorities set by the BSEC-URTA Management Council is given in the attached table.

in Bucharest on 26 May 2016 granted Observer Status to the Arab Union of Land Transport (AULT).

A High Level AULT/BSEC-URTA Bilateral Meeting was held in Beirut on 4-5 September 2016 in order to lay out main principles and framework for bilateral cooperation.

AULT and BSEC-URTA Secretaries General met in Istanbul on 22 September 2016 and elaborated a comprehensive Action Plan for AULT/BSEC-URTA Bilateral Cooperation in 2016-2017, which will be considered by the 30th meeting of the BSEC-URTA General Assembly for approval.

Further enlargement of the geographical coverage of the BSEC Permit, extension of its on usage voluntary basis 3rd the to country transport and shift from one trip usage by a truck to multiple trips usage by a company.

The Meeting of the BSEC Steering Committee on Facilitation of Road Transport of Goods, which was scheduled to take place at the BSEC PERMIS on 3-4 October 2016, was postponed.

BSEC Member States parties to the BSEC Permit system will hold a meeting in Istanbul on 10 November 2016, which will consider implementation of the system in 2017 including its further development.

BSEC PERMIS and **BSEC-URTA** requested the BSEC Member States parties to the BSEC Permit to present written information on usage of the permits in 2016 and to consider its development allowing in 2017 bγ 3rd multiple trips and Country transport operations.

In 2016, the system was based upon 450 permits per country, which are good for both bilateral and transit transport operations among and through territories of the participating States.

BSEC-URTA presented its views to the Meeting of Ministers of Transport of BSEC Member States in Belgrade on 1 November 2016, and called Ministers to make further progress as well inviting Member States, which are not participating in the BSEC Permit, yet, to join.

The Ministers took note of the BSEC-URTA presentation, favourably.

Maintained contacts with ICCIMA (Iran) in order to encourage together the Iranian authorities consider joining the BSEC Permit system.

Joint efforts with ICCIMA are needed and to be planned in order to obtain a clear position of the Iranian authorities on this matter.
