ROAD TRANSPORT HAS THE HIGHEST SHARE AMONG ALL TRANSPORT MODES -96 % IN PASSENGER TRANSPORT -92% IN GOODS TRANSPORT

THIS SITUATION AS WELL AS THE CHANGE THAT ALL MODES OF TRANSPORT INCLUDING ROAD TRANSPORT HAVE BEEN SUBJECT TO IN RECENT YEARS, REQUIRED A REVIEW ON AND RE-ORGANISATION OF THE SECTOR WITH A NEW POINT OF VIEW.



AS A RESULT OF ACTIVE EFFORTS EXERTED BY OUR MINISTRY IN RECENT YEARS, TURKEY ACHIEVED A 70% INCREASE IN THE ECMT QUOTA

THE MAIN OBJECTIVE OF OUR MINSTRY CONCERNING ROAD TRANSPORT INDUSTRY IS

TO ELIMINATE BARRIERS TO TRANSPORT AND LIBERALISATION



DISCUSSIONS AND FORECASTS CONCERNING THE FUTURE OF TRANSPORT SYSTEMS INDICATE THAT THE GROWTH IN ROAD TRANSPORT WILL CONTINUE INCREASING

THEREFORE, WE NEED TO FOLLOW-UP ANY APPROACHES AND DEVELOPMENTS WHICH COULD SERVE THE REALISATION OF THE OBJECTIVE FOR

A QUALITY TRANSPORT PERFORMED BY ENVIRONMENT-FRIENDLY VEHICLES



IN ORDER TO ACHIEVE THE LEVEL DESIRED IN THE ROAD TRANSPORT INDUSTRY WE HAVE TO REALISE THREE MAIN OBJECTIVES:

- > ESTABLISHMENT AND DEVELOPMENT OF AN INTEGRATED TRANSPORT NETWORK
- > ELIMINATION OF ALL BARRIERS TO TRADE OF GOODS AND SERVICES;
- > ESTABLISH AND EXPAND THE AWARENESS FOR SERVICE QUALITY THROUGHOUT THE INDUSTRY

PROSPECT FOR MEMBERSHIP TO EU:

THREE CRITERIA STIPULATED BY THE EU ACQUI CONCERNING ACCESS TO THE PROFESSION;

- > PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCY,
- > FINANCIAL STANDING
- > GOOD REPUTE

THE MOST SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENTS AMONG ALL SUB-SECTORS OF TRANSPORT, IN TERMS OF LEGAL HARMONISATION, HAVE BEEN ACHIEVED IN THE ROAD TRANSPORT.

- >REGULATION ON CIRCULATING CAPITAL UNDERTAKINGS, AND THE REGULATION ON OPENING VEHICLE INSPECTION STATIONS, THEIR OPERATION AND THE PRACTICE OF VEHICLE INSPECTIONS,
- >AMENDMENTS IN REGULATIONS

2- ADMINISTRATIVE/TECHNICAL CAPACITY BUILDING

- **RE-STRUCTURING THE REGIONAL DIRECTORATES IN THE MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT,**
- >STRENGTHENING THE ADMINISTRATIVE CAPACITY AND STRUCTURE OF THE GENERAL DIRECTORATE FOR LAND TRANSPORT (STAFF, EQUIPMENT AND EU ASSISTANCE PROJECT)
- > ROAD TRANSPORT AUTOMATION PROJECT (U-NET) INTERNET SERVICES,
- >ENSURING THAT "K" TYPE LICENCES ARE ISSUED BY CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE ON BEHALF OF THE TUKSIH UNION OF CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE AND COMMODITY EXCHANGES,
- >ISSUING AND GRANTING PROFESSIONAL COMPETENCY CERTIFICATES THROUGH THE UNIVERSITY
